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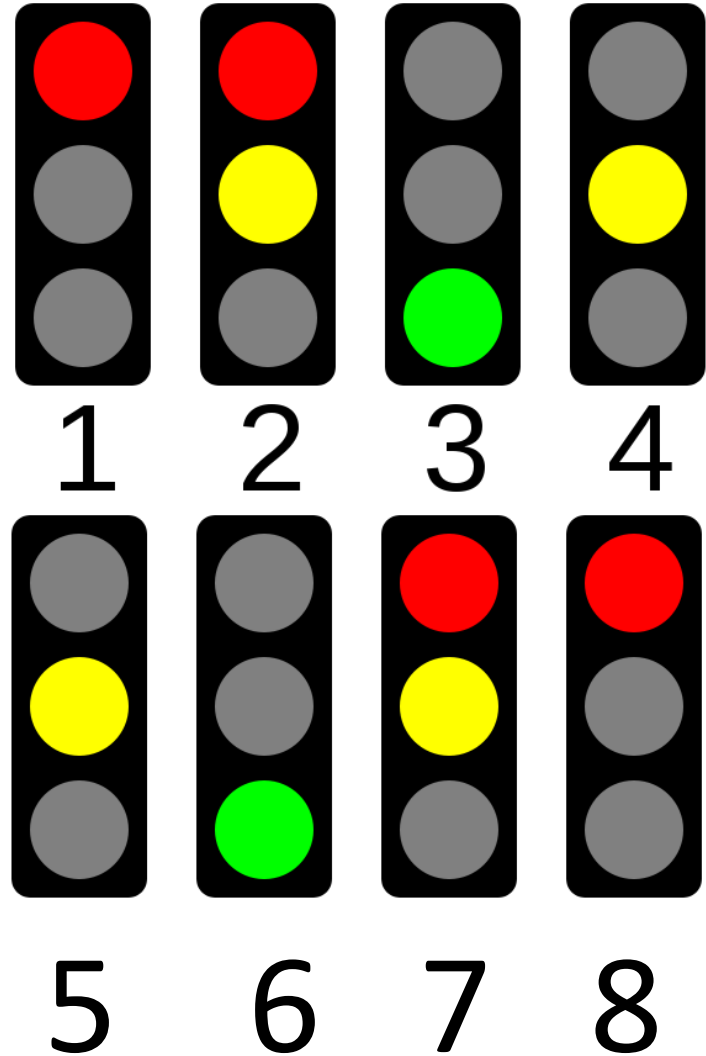
Jamaica's Open Data Readiness Assessment

- December 8-12, 2014
 - Team of six split into two tracks:
 - (1) Whole of Government,
 - (2) Ministry of Finance and Planning
 - Meeting with dozens of agencies and ministries
 - Demand side meetings (e.g. Capri, Civil Society Association, Media, Startup Jamaica)
 - Information workshop
 - Expect to deliver report in April
 - It will be the GoJ's decision whether to publish

Eight Pillars

- (8) Technology and Skills Infrastructure



Key Findings of World Bank Assessment

- Study confirmed that Jamaica could benefit in economic and social terms
- Good support at political levels
- Good datasets that could be released quickly
 - Many are already ‘public’ but not ‘reusable’
 - In most cases any charges are not a significant contribution to Agency budgets
 - Most do not raise difficult issues such as anonymization
- Jamaica has the most vibrant community of data users in region
- “Official Secrets” cultural barriers
- Work to do on Data Protection & other policies
- Human & financial resources severely limited
